Outdoor Experience

To continue form our interest in beaches and summer activities. The educators have put together a little science experiment in our sand pit. The children will participate in this activity by making the shape of the volcano and each child will participate in pouring a certain item inside the whole of the volcano. The children will get to add coloured dye to make the explosion colourful and interesting. This activity will help encourage children to



develop their fine motor skills, problem solving and creativity.

Sustainability



Toileting Signs

Family Input

Some families have recently shared with us that their child has shown interest in toileting. At shine bright we believe that toileting can be introduced in many different ways. To continue from our last activity about toileting the children wil look at our new toileting charts in the bathroom and look at our hand washing poster. Discussion and praise will assist children in their transition from nappies to using the toilet. From this experience children will become familiar with their environment.





Shell Hunting

Outdoor Experience

Today, during outdoor play, the educators will hide shells around the yard and encourage the children to find them. This is a fun way to incorporate our current interest in the beach and Summer while supporting collaborative and cooperative play experiences between children and their peers. The children will be encouraged to work together to find all of the shells that were hidden, collecting them in a bucket just as they would at the beach!
